



This charming town, named after an Egyptian battle site and established under the Returned Soldier Settlement Act, has a captivating blend of World War I heritage and idyllic countryside. During the war, El Arish in Egypt played a pivotal role as a base for the courageous ANZAC soldiers. Soldiers from all over the country who returned from both world wars were entitled to enter a ballot for blocks of land that were earmarked for sugarcane farming and El Arish in Queensland was born. The echoes of their valour still resonates through the town, with the meticulously preserved El Arish Diggers Museum, the RSL Memorial Hall, and local monuments, poignant reminders of the soldiers' sacrifice.



Spin over to the Musgravea Track for a tasty blend of off-road trail and World Heritage-listed rainforest. Around Cardwell Forest Drive are a variety of trails. Expect gravel sections, challenging ascents, thrilling descents, views to Hinchinbrook Island and beautiful swimming holes such as Attie Creek and the Cardwell Spa Pool for a cool down.

Just up the road from Innisfail is K-Tree Road and Gorrell Track boasting rugged cross-country rides for intermediate to advanced riders seeking some elevation and untamed wilderness. Top off the fun on the two new Pump Tracks in Cardwell and Innisfail. Pedal paradise on the Cassowary Coast!

Right in the heart of Tropical North Queensland is Tully, a town known for its rich history and extraordinary landscapes. The Tully Visitor and Heritage Centre serves as a gateway to this captivating town, offering a wealth of information and interpretive displays on the town's cultural heritage. Tours of the historic Tully Sugar Mill, offering a fascinating glimpse into the sugar production process, can be booked here during harvesting season.

The iconic Golden Gumboot, an oversized monument (7.9 metres) celebrating the town's prodigious rainfall, is a quirky must-see.

For those looking for a cool tip, the region boasts pristine swimming holes inviting visitors to cool off amidst the lush surroundings. Among these, the rainforest-fringed Alligators

Cardwell is a masterpiece of Mother Nature. The town hugs the coastline of the Coral Sea overlooking idyllic tropical islands, with the rugged beauty of the Cardwell Range as a backdrop. Cardwell's port serves as an access point to the amazing Hinchinbrook channel and its 45 kilometres of fully protected waters, offering the finest all-weather, all-tide fishing in North Queensland. Cardwell is also a gateway to the Great Barrier Reef and 22 islands just off the coast, including the astonishing Hinchinbrook Island, Australia's largest island national park and home to the famous Thorsborne Walking Trail.

The Cardwell Historic Precinct is a delightful museum at the site of the old Cardwell Telegraph and Post Office.

Step back in time at the Cardwell Historic Precinct. Explore interactive exhibits showcasing early colonial settlement including communications, telegraph lines, industry, cyclones, local government, police magistrates and shipwrecked sailors.

Built in 1870, it is amongst the oldest buildings in Queensland.

Away from the coast, the Cardwell Spa Pool is a geological wonder. A natural rock pool of varying shades of blue, it provides a soothing soak with a scenic backdrop, for the ultimate in natural stress relief and relaxation.

Further inland, the Girringun National Park, with its ancient rainforest, offers extraordinary hikes and unexpected wildlife encounters. Just eight kilometres south of Cardwell is the gorgeous Five Mile Swimming Hole, providing a refreshing oasis for families and adventurers.





FISHING

Fishing is a big part of life on the Cassowary Coast. No surprises really when your coastline is creeks and blue water, islands and reefs, and teeming with a variety of fishing experiences from freshwater to outer-reef in the Coral Sea. Cast your line at a huge array of species, from trophy-sized Barramundi to spirited Spanish Mackerel.

Explore estuaries, where elusive Mangrove Jacks hide, while your pot is set and waiting for some succulent Mud Crabs. Treat yourself to a day on a fishing charter with a seasoned local skipper to really make the most of your trip. It's all prime fishing adventures on the Cassowary Coast!

Only 8 kilometres off the coast is the magnificent Hinchinbrook Island, one of Australia’s largest island National Parks. As few as 7000 visitors per year visit Hinchinbrook’s pristine landscapes, which covers everything from mountainous terrain and leafy rainforests, to golden beaches.

Dunk Island is a tropical island paradise, just off the coast of Mission Beach, bursting with pristine rainforest, golden beaches, and world-class walks. Campsites are open, facilities include toilets, showers, barbecues and drinking water.

Two scenic trails lead directly from the campsite into the island's interior. The 11-kilometre Island Circuit Track around the island leads to the summit of Mount Kataloo, offering breathtaking views. For an easy stroll, take the 20-minute walk to secluded Muggy Muggy Beach for a swim and snorkel in the aquamarine waters. Transfers available from the Mission Beach Marina, so get the family together and get stranded on your very own tropical island.
